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GENERAL STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

Under general supervision, this position is responsible for the operations and programming of a licensed child care program. Reports to a Senior Recreation Program Coordinator.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

Plans, develops, and implements all components of the operations and programming of the School Age Program; researches and plans program offerings; negotiates with school personnel for bus routes/locations; ensures licensing standards are met at each facility; ensures U.S. Department of Agriculture nutritional standards are maintained within snack offerings. Accounts for funds received from various revenue producing activities; completes and maintains detailed fund records and reports.

Responsible for the effective supervision and administration of assigned staff including completing required reports, budgeting, purchasing and financial transactions which includes revenue collection, staff organization and development, performance evaluations, employee relations, prioritizing and assigning work and related activities.

Interacts with the public and others outside the work unit to obtain and provide information and assistance in a variety of circumstances. Screens and responds to inquiries and complaints; provides information on policies and procedures. Assists with developing short and long-term strategic goals pertaining to planning, development, design and operational processes of the facility; develops and recommends policies and procedures.

Performs other duties as assigned.

PERFORMANCE STANDARD

Employees at all levels are expected to effectively work together to meet the needs of the community and the organization through work behaviors demonstrating the City's Values. Employees are also expected to lead by example and demonstrate the highest level of ethics.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE

- Recreational Programming – Comprehensive knowledge of recreational programming and recreational facility operations and available resources of assigned areas to include professional recreational philosophies, principles, and practices.
- Customer Service – Thorough knowledge of principles and processes for providing customer services.

- Supervision – Thorough knowledge of leadership techniques, principles, and procedures to assign work, schedule, supervise, train, and evaluate the work of assigned staff.
- Safety - Knowledge of occupational hazards, safety precautions and safety regulations related to recreational activities and other work related precautions.

REQUIRED SKILLS

- Computer Skills - Utilizes a personal computer with word processing, spreadsheet and related software to complete a variety of administrative tasks with reasonable speed and accuracy.
- Judgement/Decision Making - Uses logic and reasoning to understand, analyze, and evaluate situations and exercise good judgment to make appropriate decisions.
- Interpersonal Relationships - Develops and maintains cooperative and professional relationships with employees at all levels, representatives from all departments, organizations and the public. Effectively responds to and resolves complex inquiries and disputes.

REQUIRED ABILITIES

- Communication - Considerable ability to effectively communicate complex ideas and proposals. Ability to listen and understand information and ideas presented verbally or in writing.
- Coordination of Work - Ability to establish and implement effective administrative programs and procedures. Ability to plan and organize daily work routine and establish priorities for the completion of work in accordance with sound time-management methodology. Performs a broad range of supervisory responsibilities over others.
- Financial Management - Ability to perform arithmetic and statistical applications to perform purchasing and financial transactions.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Requires a Bachelor's Degree in Recreation, Leisure Studies, Therapeutic Recreation or a related field and 1-2 years experience in professional recreational programs, to include 1 year of lead or supervisory experience, or an equivalent combination of education and experience that meets the standards established by Virginia Code section 22VAC40-185-190 with 2 years additional programmatic experience which includes 1 year of lead or supervisory experience.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

An acceptable general background investigation to include a local and state criminal history, sex offender registry check, and a valid driver's license with an acceptable driving record.

This position must maintain a current American Red Cross or American Heart Association CPR and First Aid Certification.

Individuals in this position cannot be listed as having a founded child abuse or neglect complaint.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Tasks require the ability to exert moderate, though not constant physical effort.
- Some combination of climbing and balancing to include climbing ladders, stooping, kneeling, crouching, and crawling.
- Some lifting, carrying, pushing and/or pulling of objects and materials of moderate weight (12-20 pounds).

SENSORY REQUIREMENTS

- Some tasks require the ability to perceive and discriminate sounds and visual cues or signals.
- Some tasks require the ability to communicate orally.

ENVIRONMENTAL EXPOSURES

Performance of essential functions may require exposure to adverse environmental conditions, such as dust, pollen, temperature and weather extremes, traffic hazards, violent individuals, infectious disease, or rude/irate customers.
