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This document is intended to provide a general overview of the population, economy and quality of life in Newport News. This profile includes information regarding demographics, social and economic characteristics, and housing conditions at both the Citywide and planning area level. For reporting purposes, the Department of Planning divided Newport News into 10 planning areas delineated by census tracts. Data is compiled from the U.S. Census, Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service, and the Hampton Roads Planning District Commission (HRPDC).

Newport News is part of the Virginia Beach-Norfolk-Newport News VA-NC Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA [more commonly known as the Hampton Roads MSA]), which is the 35th largest MSA in the United States. In addition to Newport News, the Hampton Roads MSA includes Williamsburg, James City County, Hampton, Poquoson, York County, Gloucester County, Mathews County, Portsmouth, Suffolk, Norfolk, Virginia Beach, Chesapeake, Isle of Wight County, and two counties in North Carolina (Gates and Currituck). (See page 5) Many of the cities and counties in the MSA are also members of the HRPDC, one of 21 Planning District Commissions in the Commonwealth of Virginia. This regional organization represents 17 local governments. It does not include Mathews County, Gates County, or Currituck County, but does include Franklin, Surry County, and Southhampton County.

Founded in 1896, Newport News was consolidated with the former Warwick City in 1958. Since then, it has grown to be the fifth largest city in Virginia, with a 2014 population of 181,362.

Newport News operates under a council-manager form of government that consists of a city council with representatives from three election districts (north, central, and south), along with a popularly elected, at-large mayor.


The city is long and narrow in shape; approximately 22 miles long, 7 miles wide at its widest point (including Fort Eustis) and 1 mile wide at its narrowest point. There are approximately 244 miles of shoreline (including inland areas and Fort Eustis).


Newport News has an elaborate transportation network, including interstate and state highways, bridges and a bridge-tunnel, freight and passenger railroad service, local transit bus and intercity bus service, and a commercial airport. There are miles of waterfront docks and port facilities. The city is served by three airports, all of which cater to passengers from Hampton Roads: Newport News/Williamsburg International Airport located in Newport News, Norfolk International Airport, and Richmond International Airport.

As shown on page 8, the 10 planning areas in Newport News are: Southeast; Downtown/Huntington; Parkview/Newmarket; North Newport News/Morrison; Riverfront; Greater Oyster Point; Denbigh; Richneck; Lee Hall and Fort Eustis.





GLOSSARY



AGE: Age is generally derived from date of birth information, and is based on the age of the person in complete years.

AGGREGATE: The sum of the values for each of the elements in the universe. For example, aggregate household income is the sum of the income of all households in a given geographic area. Aggregates are frequently used in computing mean values (mean equals aggregate divided by universe count).

CENSUS TRACT: A small, relatively permanent statistical subdivision of a county delineated by a local committee of census data users for the purpose of presenting data. Census tract boundaries normally follow visible features, but may follow governmental unit boundaries and other non-visible features in some instances; they always nest within counties. Designed to be relatively homogeneous units with respect to population characteristics, economic status, and living conditions at the time of establishment, census tracts average about 4,000 inhabitants. They may be split by any sub-county geographic entity.

CHILD: A son or a daughter by birth, a stepchild, or an adopted child, regardless of the child's age or marital status.

EMPLOYMENT STATUS: Employment status identifies those who 1) worked at any time during the reference week; 2) were on temporary layoff and available for work; 3) did not work during the reference week but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent (excluding layoff); 4) did not work during the reference week but were looking for work during the last few weeks and were available to work during the reference week; and 5) were not in the labor force.

FAMILY: A group of two or more people who reside together and who are related by birth, marriage, or adoption.

FAMILY HOUSEHOLD (FAMILY): A family includes a householder and one or more people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. All people in a household who are related to the householder are regarded as members of his or her family. A family household may contain people not related to the householder, but those people are not included as part of the householder's family. Thus, the number of family households is equal to the number of families, but family households may include more members than do families. Not all households contain families since a household may comprise a group of unrelated people or one person living alone.

FAMILY HOUSEHOLDER: a householder living with one or more people related to him or her by birth, marriage, or adoption. The householder and all people in the household related to him are family members.

FAMILY INCOME: This includes the income of the householder and all other individuals 15 years old and over related to the householder.

FAMILY SIZE: Refers to the number of people in a family.

FAMILY TYPE: Refers to how the members of a family are related to one another. Families may be a "Married Couple Family," "Female householder, no spouse present" or "Male householder, no spouse present".

FEMALE HOUSEHOLDER: A female maintaining a household with no husband present.

HOUSEHOLD: A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit as their usual place of residence.

HOUSEHOLD INCOME: This includes the income of the householder and all other individuals 15 years old and over in the household, whether they are related to the householder or not.

HOUSEHOLD POPULATION: All U.S. residents who live in housing units such as single family homes, townhouses, apartments, and mobile homes.

HOUSEHOLD SIZE: The total number of people living in a housing unit.

HOUSEHOLD TYPE: Households are classified by type according to the sex of the householder and the presence of relatives. Examples include: married-couple family; male householder, no wife present; female householder, no husband present.

HOUSEHOLDER: The person, or one of the people, in whose name the home is owned, being bought, or rented. If there is no such person present, any household member 15 years old and over can serve as the householder.

HOUSING UNIT: A house, an apartment, a mobile home or trailer, a group of rooms, or a single room occupied as separate living quarters, or if vacant, intended for occupancy as separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which the occupants live separately from any other individuals in the building and which have direct access from outside the building or through a common hall.

INCOME: "Total income" is the sum of the amounts reported separately for wages, salary, commissions, bonuses, or tips; self-employment income from own nonfarm or farm businesses, including proprietorships and partnerships; interest, dividends, net rental income, royalty income, or income from estates and trusts; Social Security or Railroad Retirement income; Supplemental Security Income (SSI); any public assistance or welfare payments from the state or local welfare office; retirement, survivor, or disability pensions; and any other sources of income received regularly such as Veterans' (VA) payments, unemployment compensation, child support, or alimony.

MEDIAN INCOME: The median income divides the income distribution into two equal groups, one having incomes above the median, and other having incomes below the median.

NON-FAMILY HOUSEHOLDER: A householder living alone or with non-relatives only.

MEDIAN: This measure represents the middle value (if n is odd) or the average of the two middle values (if n is even) in an ordered list of data values. The median divides the total frequency distribution into two equal parts: one-half of the cases fall below the median and one-half of the cases exceed the median.

MEDIAN AGE: The median age is the age at the midpoint of the population. Half of the population is older than the median age and half of the population is younger. The median age is often used to describe the "age" of a population.

MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION TO WORK: The principal mode of travel or type of conveyance, by distance rather than time, that the worker usually used to get from home to work during the employment status reference week.

POPULATION: All people, male and female, child and adult, living in a given geographic area.

OWNER-OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT: A housing unit is owner occupied if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid for.

PER CAPITA INCOME: Average obtained by dividing aggregate income by total population of an area.

PLANNING AREA: A geographic area used for planning and data collection purposes. Newport News is comprised of ten planning areas.

RACE: The data on race were derived from answers to the question on race that was asked of all people. The U.S. Census Bureau collects race data in accordance with guidelines provided by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB), and these data are based on self-identification. The racial categories included in the census questionnaire generally reflect a social definition of race recognized in this country, and not an attempt to define race biologically, anthropologically, or genetically. In addition, it is recognized that the categories of the race item include racial and national origin or socio-cultural groups.

RENTER-OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT: All occupied units which are not owner occupied, whether they are rented for cash rent or occupied without payment of cash rent, are classified as renter-occupied.

SEX: An individual's biological sex - male or female.

SPOUSE: Includes a person married to and living with a householder who is of the opposite sex of the householder. The category "husband or wife" includes people in formal marriages, as well as people in common-law marriages. In tabulations, unless otherwise specified, "Spouse" does not include same-sex married couples even if the marriage was performed in a state issuing marriage certificates for same-sex couples.

TRAVEL TIME TO WORK: The total number of minutes that it usually took the worker to get from home to work during the employment status reference week.

VACANT HOUSING UNIT: A housing unit is vacant if no one is living in it at the time of enumeration, unless its occupants are only temporarily absent. Units temporarily occupied at the time of enumeration entirely by people who have a usual residence elsewhere are also classified as vacant.

VALUE: The respondent's estimate of how much the property (house and lot, mobile home and lot, or condominium unit) would sell for if it were for sale. For vacant units, value was the price asked for the property.

YEAR BUILT: The data on year structure built were obtained from both occupied and vacant housing units. Year structure built refers to when the building was first constructed, not when it was remodeled, added to, or converted. The data relate to the number of units built during the specified periods that were still in existence at the time of enumeration.
